      1. Possible solutions
        - a. Rent the soccer fields during the event to limit the need for the public to cross over the course
        - b. Build a temporary bridge to allow traffic and pedestrian traffic to cross
        - c. Our city permit requires that the public have access to the soccer field, even if it is rented
        - d. The city permit only ensures that CIF has use of the designated area for our event
  - c. Slower runners
    - i. Caution tape was used to move slower runners over to help avoid collisions. It is suggested to have an adult monitor the end of each race to help avoid any situations
  - d. Course analysis

- i. A review of the state results of the last 10 years and how it compared to the new course indicated no adverse effect with how the section did as a whole in the state meet
  - ii. Consensus is the course doesn't need to be tweaked
