



WRESTLING POST- SEASON MINUTES

Meeting took place at the CIFSDS office on Monday, March 12, 2018, with the Boys Wrestling Advisory group.

Discussion took place on several items. Highlights from this discussion are for your review below:

Officials Concerns/ Comments:

- Voiced concerns about the growing number of tournaments and getting officials to those as many are scheduling on the same day.
- Divisionals and Masters went well, but there was an issue with grooming checks at one site. Official's rep said they would work on their training.
- Coaches voiced concerns about overzealous officials. Official's rep reminded them they have the ability to request that an official not do their duals, but that is not the case for tournaments.
- Official's rep inquired about using 2 officials per mat for each of the quarter final matches at Masters next year. It was decided that this would be determined next year before the tournament.

CIFSDS Office:

- Discussion took place regarding the boys and girls combining on the second day of the Masters tournament for next year since the state tourney will be moving in that direction next year.

- Trevor Keifer presented a plan to the boy's advisory group in how this could work with only the top 8 in each weight class (112 total girls) advancing to the Masters meet on Saturday. He thought it might take an additional 2 hours (does not include the time for introductions before finals and the awards ceremony) to make this happen and that it would be a positive experience for all of the student athletes.
- Advisory voiced concerns about the size of the venue (specifically overcrowding and parking) and how that would affect anyone trying to host this event in the future. It could work at San Marcos next year and the following year when it is held in the IVL, but they had reservations based on the other facilities they could use in the future.
- They also voiced concerns about weigh-ins and the fact that there are not enough qualified women to do that. Plus, a large facility will be needed to accommodate both the boys and the girls weigh-ins (possibly in separate locker rooms).
- The Commissioner reminded the advisory that the final say would come from the section office in regards to the boys and girls combining at the Masters for that Saturday. However, he did want to hear their concerns.
- Discussion took place about Dual Championships after looking at the past three years and the struggles we have had in getting teams to compete. It was decided that we will not have a dual championship next year. Our section champs will be crowned in the divisional meets.
- Ron Rogers handed out a break down of the results from Masters to all of the advisory members.
- Advisory committee also selected the Coach of the Year, Wayne Branstetter from Poway and Wrestler of the Year, Jaden Abas from Rancho Bernardo.
